FDOT Completes NE 203 Street/Ives Dairy Road Intersection Project *From West Dixie Highway to SR 5/US 1/Biscayne Boulevard*

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation has completed an intersection improvement project along NE 203 Street/Ives Dairy Road from West Dixie Highway to State Road (SR) 5/US 1/Biscayne Boulevard in Miami-Dade County.

The \$43.6 million project, which began in the fall of 2021, enhances safety and operational improvements through this busy intersection. MasTec Civil was the contractor.

The project included elevating westbound NE 203 Street over the Florida East Coast Railway (FEC) tracks and West Dixie Highway; constructing a pedestrian bridge over the FEC tracks; widening the roadway along southbound US 1 and eastbound NE 203 Street, including the bridge; improving drainage along the corridor; updating pedestrian ramps, signage, pavement markings and lighting; and, installing a bicycle lane along West Dixie Highway between NE 206 Street and NE 202 Street.
