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FDOT Golden Glades Interchange (GGI) Project Lane and Ramp Closures & Detours

Tuesday, May 28 to Friday, May 31

MIAMI, Fla. – As part of the ongoing interchange reconstruction work, contractors for the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will be implementing various roadway closures and detours. These closures will allow crews to perform bridge work, roadway paving and temporary concrete barrier wall installation. These closures and detours will be in place between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m.

Note: lane closures will be suspended from Friday, May 24 until Tuesday morning, May 28 for the Memorial Day holiday.

Around-the-clock closure starting Tuesday, May 28:

NW 6 Avenue will be closed between NW 151 Street and NW 162 Street while construction crews work on stormwater drainage improvements for the Golden Glades Interchange (GGI) Project. Contractors for Florida Power & Light (FPL) and City of North Miami Beach will also be performing utility work along NW 6 Avenue. A detour will be in place for several months to complete this phase of work.

Drivers and pedestrians who want to go north onto NW 6 Avenue from the intersection of NW 151 Street and NW 6 Avenue will be detoured as follows:

- Go east along NW 151 Street
- Turn right onto southbound South Biscayne River Drive
- Take the third exit at the roundabout onto northbound North Miami Avenue
- Turn left onto northbound Memorial Highway, which converts to NW 2 Avenue
- Continue north along NW 2 Avenue to NW 165 Street

Drivers and pedestrians who want to go south onto NW 6 Avenue from the intersection of NW 165 Street and NW 2 Avenue will be detoured as follows:

- Continue south along NW 2 Avenue, which converts to Memorial Highway
- Turn right onto southbound North Miami Avenue
- Turn right onto northbound South Biscayne River Drive
- Turn left onto westbound NW 151 Street
- Continue west along NW 151 Street to NW 6 Avenue

Tuesday, May 28 through Friday, May 31:

The ramps and roadways listed below will be closed and traffic will be detoured as follows:

- 1. Ramp from Opa-locka Boulevard to northbound Interstate (I-95)
- 2. Ramp from northbound I-95 to NW 167 Street
- 3. Ramp from northbound State Road (SR) 9 to the interchange
- 4. Ramp from northbound SR 7/US 441/NW 7 Avenue to the interchange
- 5. Southbound and northbound I-95 Express Lanes
 - 1. Drivers on Opa-locka Boulevard, who want to go north on I-95 will be detoured as follows:
 - Go north on SR 7/US 441/NW 7 Avenue
 - Take the ramp for northbound I-95 at the Golden Glades Interchange
 - 2. Drivers going north on I-95, who want to exit at NW 167 Street will be detoured as follows:
 - Continue north on I-95 and take the ramp to SR 7/US 441/NW 2 Avenue
 - Turn left onto westbound NW 7 Avenue Extension
 - Continue west for westbound Palmetto Expressway
 - Exit at NW 12 Avenue and turn left onto southbound NW 12 Avenue
 - Turn left onto eastbound NW 167 Street and take the ramp for eastbound Palmetto Expressway
 - Exit at SR 826 Beaches for NW 167 Street
 - 3. Drivers going north on SR 9, who want to access the Golden Glades Interchange will be detoured as follows:
 - Go east on NW 135 Street
 - Take the ramp onto northbound I-95
 - 4. Drivers going north on SR 7/US 441/NW 7 Avenue, who want to access the Golden Glades Interchange will be detoured as follows:
 - Go south on SR 7/US 441/NW 7 Avenue
 - Turn left onto eastbound NW 135 Street
 - Take the ramp onto northbound I-95
 - 5. Drivers who want to take the northbound and southbound I-95 Express Lanes between NW 30 Street and NW 183 Street/Miami Gardens Drive, will be directed to use the general purpose lanes along I-95.

Wednesday, May 29 and Thursday, May 30:

The ramps and roadways listed below will be closed and traffic will be detoured as follows:

- 1. Ramp from NW 167 Street to southbound I-95
- 2. Ramp from SR 7/US 441/NW 2 Avenue to southbound I-95
 - 1. Drivers going west on NW 167 Street, who want to go south on I-95 will be detoured as follows:
 - Continue west and take the ramp to westbound Sr 826/Palmetto Expressway
 - Exit at NW 12 Avenue and turn left onto southbound NW 12 Avenue
 - Turn left onto eastbound NW 167 Street and take the ramp onto eastbound Palmetto Expressway
 - Take the ramp to southbound I-95

- 2. Drivers going south on SR 7/US 441/NW 2 Avenue, who want to go south on I-95 will be detoured as follows:
 - Continue south along SR 7/US 441/NW 2 Avenue, which converts to SR 7/US 441/NW 7 Avenue
 - Turn left onto eastbound NW 135 Street
 - Take the ramp onto southbound I-95

These lane closures below will occur nightly as needed:

I-95 between NW 135 Street and the Golden Glades Interchange

From 11 p.m. to 5 a.m., up to two lanes in both directions will be closed as needed.

Palmetto Expressway between NW 12 Avenue and NW 7 Avenue Extension

- At 9 p.m., one lane in both directions will be closed as needed.
- At 11 p.m., a second lane in both directions will be closed as needed.

Florida's Turnpike between NW 183 Street/Miami Gardens Drive and I-95

From 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., up to two lanes in both directions will be closed as needed.

Detours will be clearly marked. Please follow all posted signage and note that this schedule may change due to weather or other unexpected conditions.
