SR 913/Rickenbacker Causeway Flyover Bridge Ramp Closures Begin Monday, July 8

MIAMI, Fla. – As part of the necessary ongoing rehabilitation work, contractors for the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will close the westbound ramp of State Road (SR) 913/ Rickenbacker Causeway Flyover Bridge starting Monday, July 8 through Saturday, August 3.

This work will occur in two stages as follows:

Monday, July 8 at 1 a.m. through Saturday, July 20 at 6 a.m.:

The ramp from westbound Rickenbacker Causeway to **southbound** SR 5/US 1 will be closed from Monday, July 8 through Saturday, July 20. During this closure, the ramp from westbound Rickenbacker Causeway to northbound SR 9A/I-95 will remain open.

Sunday, July 21 at 10 p.m. through Saturday, August 3 at 6 a.m.:

The ramp from westbound Rickenbacker Causeway to **northbound** SR 9A/I-95 will be closed from Sunday, July 21 through Saturday, August 3. During this closure, the ramp from westbound Rickenbacker Causeway to southbound SR 5/US 1 will remain open.

Please expect heavy traffic and delays along the Rickenbacker Causeway and surrounding areas during these closures. Detours will be clearly marked. Please follow all posted signage and note that this schedule may change due to weather or other unexpected conditions.
