## SR 90/SW 8 Street/Tamiami Trail Next Steps Phase 2 Project Traffic Shift

*Eastbound lane shifted near structure S-334, 1.5 miles west of  
SR 997/SW 177 Avenue/Krome Avenue*

**MIAMI, Fla.** – As part of the ongoing Tamiami Trail Next Steps Phase 2 Project, contractors for the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will be implementing a traffic shift today along eastbound State Road (SR) 90/SW 8 Street/Tamiami Trail near the structure S-334, which is approximately 1.5 miles west of SR 997/SW 177 Avenue/Krome Avenue. This traffic shift will allow drainage and roadway work to continue in the eastern segment of the project.

While the new traffic pattern is being established, a temporary detour will be set up to provide access to the S-334 ramp and Everglades Airboat Expeditions. For drivers traveling east on SR 90/SW 8 Street/Tamiami Trail wishing to access this area will be detoured as follows:

- Continue east on SR 90/SW 8 Street/Tamiami Trail
- Make a U-turn at the first median opening past SR 997/SW 177 Avenue/Krome Avenue
- Travel west on SW 90/SW 8 Street/Tamiami Trail
- Turn into the entrance for S-334 and Everglades Airboat Expeditions.

This detour is expected to be in place until Wednesday morning, July 17. Westbound traffic along SR 90/SW 8 Street/Tamiami Trail will not be impacted.
