FDOT and Local Officials Celebrate Completion of Golden Glades Multimodal Transportation Facility (GGMTF) Project

March 4, 2022

MIAMI, Fla. – On Friday, March 4, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Six, in partnership with Miami-Dade County and regional transit providers celebrated the completion of the GGMTF Project and its grand opening with a Ribbon Cutting Ceremony.

“After three years of construction and close collaboration with Miami-Dade County and our regional transportation partners, we’re here to celebrate the completion of this new state-of-the-art and much-needed transportation facility,” said FDOT District Six Secretary Stacy L. Miller, P.E. “The Department’s priority is to provide commuters with a safe and efficient transportation system for all modes.”

The design-build project began the week of August 6, 2018. The existing Golden Glades Park & Ride Center was upgraded with a new and modern integrated Multimodal Transportation Facility. The estimated cost of the project was \$60 million and it was successfully completed in February 2022. LEAD Engineering was the contractor.

The GGMTF serves to connect Miami-Dade and Broward County Transit metrobuses, Tri-Rail and ride-sharing throughout the areas of I-95, US 441/NW 7 Avenue and the SR 826/Palmetto Expressway.
