## Full Closure of NW 22 Avenue Railroad Crossing at Ali Baba Avenue Extended Due to Heavy Rains

**MIAMI, Fla.** – Due to current weather conditions, the full closure of the NW 22 Avenue Railroad Crossing, from Ali Baba Avenue to State Road (SR) 9, expected to reopen on June 12, is being extended until further notice. The rehabilitation work is being performed by contractors for the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority (SFRTA) in coordination with the Florida Department of Transportation. During this closure traffic is being detoured as follows:

#### Southbound Detour:

- Turn right on NW 151 Street
- Turn left on NW 27 Avenue
- Turn left on NW 135 Street to go back to NW 22 Avenue

#### Alternative Southbound Detour:

- Turn right on Ali Baba Avenue
- Turn left on NW 27 Avenue
- Turn left on NW 135 Street to go back to NW 22 Avenue

#### Northbound Detour:

- Turn left on SR 9
- Turn right on NW 27 Avenue
- Turn right on NW 151 Street to go back to NW 22 Avenue
