Full Closure of Frontage Road between NW 114 Street and NW 92 Avenue

June 23 through June 26, 2024

MIAMI, Fla. – Starting at 9 p.m. on Sunday, June 23 to Wednesday, June 26, 2024, travel lanes along Frontage Road will be fully closed for three nights between NW 114 Street to NW 92 Avenue. The lanes will reopen to traffic daily by 5 a.m. This closure will allow the contractor to connect two underground drainage pipes. Please note, this is a nighttime operation and construction noise is expected. The following detours will be implemented:

- Motorists heading northwest along Frontage Road will be detoured to make a right at NW 92 Avenue, make a left at NW 114 Street and make a right on Frontage Road to continue heading northwest.
- Motorists heading southeast along Frontage Road will be detoured to make a left at NW 114 Street, make a right at NW 92 Avenue and make a left on Frontage Road to continue heading southeast.

Detours will be clearly marked and access to neighborhoods will be maintained at all times. Please follow all posted signage and note that this schedule may change due to weather or other unexpected conditions.

This project is part of the corridor wide reconstruction of the SR 25/US 27/Okeechobee Road from the Broward County Line to SR 826/Palmetto Expressway. This work will improve safety, enhance mobility along this Strategic Intermodal Systems (SIS) corridor, and inspire innovative transportation solutions, connecting commuters throughout Miami-Dade County.
