Northbound I-95 Closed June 12 to Complete Traffic Shift

NW 8 Street to NW 17 Street

MIAMI, Fla. – On Wednesday, June 12, all northbound lanes on Interstate 95 (I-95) will be closed from 10 p.m. to 5:30 a.m., between NW 8 Street and NW 17 Street, to allow workers to shift northbound travel lanes by Thursday morning, June 13.

During this closure drivers going north on I-95 who want to continue northbound should:

- Take the eastbound I-395 ramp
- Exit at NE 2 Avenue/Biscayne Boulevard (Exit 2B)
- Turn right at NE 2 Avenue, then turn right at NE 11 Street
- o Turn right at NE 1 Avenue, to access the ramp to I-95 to continue north

The northbound I-95 ramp to westbound SR 836 will also be closed Wednesday between the hours of 10 p.m. and 5:30 a.m.

During this closure drivers who want to go west on SR 836 should:

- Enter the eastbound I-395 ramp
- Exit at NE 2 Avenue/Biscayne Boulevard (Exit 2B)
- Turn right on NE 2 Avenue
- Turn right on NE 11 Street
- Turn right on NE 1 Avenue to access westbound I-395 to continue onto westbound SR 836

A new northbound traffic pattern will be in place between NW 8 Street and NW 17 Street, when the road reopens at 5:30 a.m., Thursday, June 12.

Please note this schedule may change due to weather or other unforeseen conditions. The work is part of the I-395/SR 836/I-95 Design-Build Project that is reconstructing the I-395 corridor from the SR 836/I-395/I-95 (Midtown) Interchange to the MacArthur Causeway Bridge.
