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**FDOT to Host SR 5/US 1/North Roosevelt Boulevard  
Design Project Public Meeting**  
*June 18, 2024*

**MIAMI, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a meeting for a roadway design project along State Road (SR) 5/US 1/North Roosevelt Boulevard from Eisenhower Drive to South Roosevelt Boulevard, starting at 5 p.m. on Tuesday, June 18, 2024.

The Hybrid (In-Person and Online) Public Meeting will be held at the City of Key West City Hall - Commission Chambers, 1300 White Street, Key West, FL 33040. Click [here](#) to register.

Proposed improvements include: Adding pedestrian countdown signals to existing traffic light poles; updating curb ramps and sidewalk, replacing signage, trimming or relocating landscape and repaving and restriping the road.

Construction is scheduled to start in fall 2025 and last about eight months. The preliminary construction cost is \$5.2 million.

The meeting will consist of a formal presentation followed by an open discussion. Staff will be available to answer questions in the order they are received and as time permits. If your question is not responded to during the meeting, a response will be provided in writing afterwards.
