# SR 5/Overseas Highway Along Channel 5 Bridge Nighttime Lane Closures Begin Sunday, June 30

**MIAMI, Fla.** – As part of necessary ongoing rehabilitation work, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will begin repairs along State Road (SR) 5/Overseas Highway along Channel 5 Bridge on Sunday, June 30. Work will be performed between the hours of 8 p.m. and 6 a.m. during the days shown below:

# Sunday, June 30 through Wednesday, July 3:

During these closures, flaggers will periodically stop traffic in one direction to allow traffic from the opposite direction to pass and one lane will remain open to traffic at all times.

## Sunday, July 7 through Sunday, August 4:

During this four-week period, flaggers will periodically stop traffic in one direction to allow traffic from the opposite direction to pass and one lane will remain open to traffic at all times.

Detours will be clearly marked. Please follow all posted signage and note that this schedule may change due to weather or other unexpected conditions.
