SR 9A/I-95 Ramp Nighttime Ramp Closures Begin Sunday, September 29

MIAMI, Fla. – Beginning on Sunday, September 29, nighttime ramp closures will be in place on multiple ramps to allow for concrete work. Detours will be in place to access northbound SR 9A/Interstate 95 (I-95) and southbound SR 5/US 1. All lanes will re-open for traffic by 6 a.m. during the weekdays.

Sunday, September 29 and Monday, September 30

The northbound SR 9A/I-95 exit ramp to SE 1 Avenue will be closed from 9 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. to perform concrete work and a detour will be implemented to access SE 1 Avenue. All lanes will re-open for traffic by 5:30 a.m. during the weekdays.

During this closure, drivers going north on SR 9A/I-95 who want to go on to SE 1 Avenue should:

- Stay in the left lane to go towards SE 2 Avenue/Biscayne Boulevard
- Continue straight on SE 3 Street
- Turn left on SE 3 Avenue
- Turn left on SE 2 Street to reach SE 1 Avenue

Sunday, September 29 through Tuesday, October 1

The northbound SR 9A/I-95 exit ramp to Miami Avenue will be closed from 9 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. to perform concrete work and a detour will be implemented to access Miami Avenue. All lanes will re-open for traffic by 5:30 a.m. during the weekdays.

During this closure, drivers going north on SR 9A/I-95 who want to go on to Miami Avenue should:

- Stay in the right lane to go towards Biscayne Boulevard
- Continue straight on SE 3 Street
- Turn left onto SE 3 Avenue
- Turn left onto SE 2 Street to reach Miami Avenue

Sunday, September 29 through Wednesday, October 2

The northbound SR 9A/I-95 exit ramp to SW 8 Street will be closed from 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. to perform concrete work and a detour will be implemented to access SW 8 Street. All lanes will re-open for traffic by 6 a.m. during the weekdays.

During this closure, drivers who wish to go north on SR 9A/I-95 who want to go on to SW 8 Street should:

- Continue north on SR 9A/I-95 and exit on Biscayne Boulevard Downtown (Exit 2A)
- Turn right onto 2 Avenue
- Continue straight to reach SR 5/US 1
- Turn onto SW 8 Street

Sunday, September 29 through Thursday, October 3

The SW 8 Street southbound SR 9A/I-95 entrance ramp will be closed from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. to perform concrete work and a detour will be implemented to access southbound SR 5/US 1. All lanes will re-open for traffic by 6 a.m. during the weekdays.

During this closure, drivers going east on SR 90/SW 8 Street who want to go onto southbound SR 9A/I-95 should:

- Continue straight on SR 90/SW 8 Street
- Turn right onto SW 2 Avenue
- Turn right onto SW 13 Street
- Turn left onto SW 3 Avenue
- Turn left onto SW 26 Road to reach SR 5/US 1

The southbound SR 9A/I-95 exit ramp to SW 25 Road (1A) will close two lanes between the hours of 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. to perform drainage and concrete work. At least one lane will remain open, and all lanes will re-open for traffic by 6 a.m. during the weekdays.

Monday, September 30 through Thursday, October 3

The southbound SR 9A/I-95 exit ramp (1B) to SW 7 Street/Brickell Avenue will be closed from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. to perform concrete work and a detour will be implemented to access SR 90/SW 7 Street / Brickell Avenue. All lanes will re-open for traffic by 6 a.m. during the weekdays.

During this closure, drivers going south on SR 9A/I-95 who want to go on to SR 90/SW 7 Street/SW 8 Street should:

- Stay in the left lane to go towards Rickenbacker Causeway / Key Biscayne
- Use the exit ramp (1A) from southbound SR 9A/I-95
- Turn left onto SW 25 Road
- Use the entrance ramp onto northbound SR 9A/I-95 from SW 25 Road
- Use the exit ramp (1B) from northbound SR 9A/I-95 to SR 90/SW 8 Street / Brickell Avenue

The SW 8 Street inner loop entrance ramp onto northbound SR 9A/I-95 will be closed between the hours of 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. to perform concrete work.

During this closure, drivers going east on SR 90/SW 8 Street who want to go onto northbound SR 9A/I-95 should use the outer loop entrance ramp on SW 8 Street. All lanes will re-open for traffic by 6 a.m. during the weekdays.

The entrance ramp from SW 25 Road onto northbound SR 9A/I-95 will be closed between the hours of 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. to perform drainage work.

During this closure, drivers who wish to go north on SR 9A/I-95 should:

- Continue on SW 25 Road to reach South Miami Avenue
- Turn left onto South Miami Avenue
- Turn left onto SW 7 Street
- Turn left onto SW 3 Avenue and continue to reach the SW 8 Street entrance ramp onto northbound SR 9A/I-95

Thursday, October 3

The SW 8 Street outer loop entrance ramp onto northbound SR 9A/I-95 will be closed for one night between the hours of 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. to perform concrete work.

During this closure, drivers going south on SW 3 Avenue who want to go onto northbound SR 9A/I-95 should use the inner loop entrance ramp on SW 8 Street. All lanes will re-open for traffic by 6 a.m. during the weekdays.
