## State Road (SR) 9/NW 27 Avenue Full Railroad Closure Begins Tuesday, April 5

**MIAMI, Fla.** – The Florida East Coast Railway (FEC), in coordination with the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), will close the SR 9 /NW 27 Avenue railroad crossing just north of NW 73 Street in the City of Miami from 6 a.m., Tuesday, April 5 through 11:59 p.m., Thursday, April 7, 2022. This detour is being established to allow workers to replace the railroad tracks and repave the area.

During this closure, all traffic will be detoured away from the crossing and directed to follow signs to alternate local streets. Access to local businesses shall be maintained through detour routes. Traffic will be detoured as follows:

## Northbound Detour:

- Turn right on NW 62 Street
- Turn left on NW 22 Avenue
- Turn left on NW 79 Street to get back to SR 9/NW 27 Avenue

## Northbound Alternate Detour

- Turn left on NW 71 Street
- Turn right on NW 32 Avenue
- Turn right on NW 79 Street to get back to SR 9/NW 27 Avenue

## Southbound Detour:

- Turn right on NW 79 Street
- Turn left on NW 32 Avenue
- Turn right on NW 71 Street to get back to SR 9/NW 27 Avenue

Please note this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
