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




#### **Typical Section Replacement Alternatives 2A & 2B**



# **Cultural Resources – Section 4(F)**



#### Pelican Harbor Park and Marina

- 0.29-acre permanent easement needed to upgrade sidewalks, lighting and guardrail
- 0.12-acre temporary construction easement

#### North Bay Village Dog Park

 Temporary construction easement needed for driveway reconstruction and harmonization Section 4(f) refers to the original section within the **U.S. Department of Transportation Act of 1966** which provided for consideration of park and recreation lands, wildlife and waterfowl refuges, and historic sites during transportation project development.

## **Physical Environment**

- Utilities located within the right-of way or mounted on the bridges may require relocation
- Contamination Potential








## **Right-of-Way**

- This project will not cause any relocation of families or businesses.
- All right of way acquisition will be conducted in accordance with Florida Statute § 339.09 and § 421.55 and also the federal Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, commonly known as the Uniform Act.




