ABOUT THE STUDY

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Six, has initiated a PD&E Study for the SR 9A/I-95 Corridor from south of NW 62 Street to north of NW 143 Street. The study is located between north of the SR 112/I-195 interchange and south of the Golden Glades Interchange (GGI) in northern Miami-Dade County, Florida.

This PD&E Study builds on the I-95 Corridor Planning Study completed in 2019 by FDOT and will further evaluate, develop concepts, and provide information necessary for FDOT to reach a decision on the location, and conceptual design to meet the project's purpose and need.



PURPOSE OF THE STUDY

The purpose and need for this project is to:

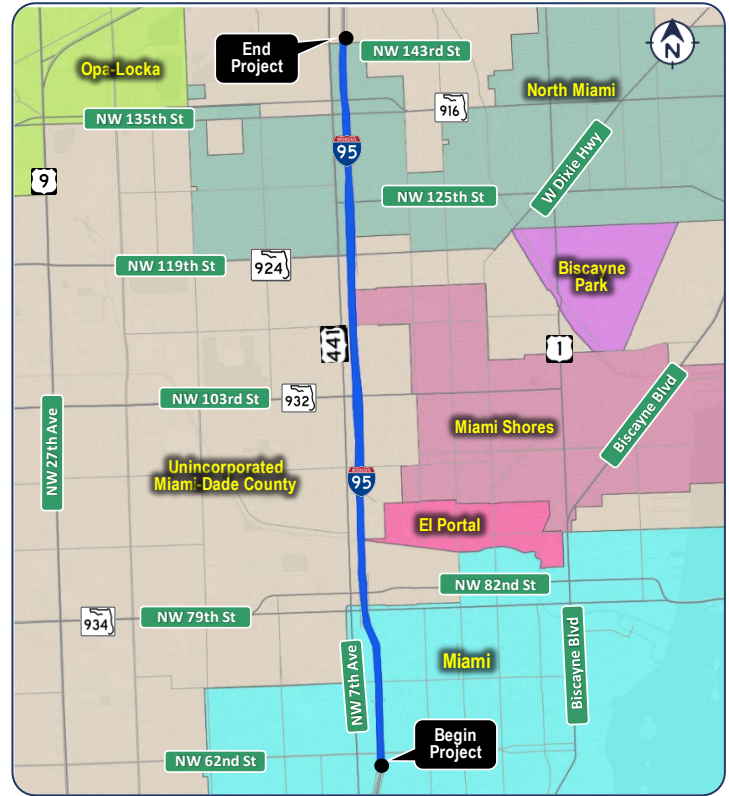
- Address the operational deficiencies to relieve current and anticipated future congestion along the SR 9A/I-95 corridor
- Preserve the operational integrity and regional functionality of SR 9A/I-95
- Enhance emergency evacuation and response times
- Enhance safety and mobility needs of the community



SCHEDULE & FUNDING

This PD&E Study started in June 2024 and is expected to be completed in late 2027. The design and construction phases have not yet been funded. Preliminary construction costs will be developed during the PD&E phase.

A PD&E Study is a comprehensive study that evaluates social, economic, and environmental effects associated with a proposed transportation improvement so FDOT can reach a decision on the location, and conceptual design to meet the project's purpose and need.
