FDOT Announces Flashing Yellow Arrow Signal to the City of Hialeah

At the SR 934/W/E 21 Street & Palm Avenue Intersection

MIAMI, Fla. – As part of the ongoing State Road (SR) 934/W/E 21 Street/NW 74 Street roadway project from W 4 Avenue to E 4 Avenue, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will activate a new flashing yellow arrow traffic signal at the intersection of SR 934/W/E 21 Street and Palm Avenue on June 21, 2025.

This signal marks the first installation of its kind in Hialeah, part of FDOT's ongoing efforts to enhance roadway safety and optimize traffic operations. The flashing yellow arrow is a safety feature that allows drivers to make a left turn after yielding to oncoming vehicles and pedestrians, while keeping traffic flowing smoothly through the intersection.

Understanding the New Signal:

- Green Arrow Proceed with left turn.
- Flashing Yellow Arrow Turn left with caution after yielding to traffic and pedestrians.
- Solid Yellow Arrow Prepare to stop; the signal is about to turn red.
- Red Arrow Drivers must stop.
- FDOT encourages all motorists to stay alert and become familiar with this new signal pattern. Educational resources and signage will be available to help drivers adjust to the change.

Please follow all posted signage and note that the schedule may change due to weather or other unexpected conditions.

Remember, wearing a safety belt is the single most effective way to protect people and reduce fatalities in motor vehicle crashes. Always be safe and remain alert while driving in construction zones.
